### **SOME THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW**

- ▶▶ *Four submission options:* Your video can take the form of a training or instruction video or a public service announcement (PSA). Posters may be submitted separately or with a video for a "combined entry."
- ▶▶ Keep training videos to two minutes or less, PSAs to 30 seconds or less.
- ▶▶ The video or poster should address computing security problems and effective ways of handling them.
- ▶▶ Send in your entry by **April 30, 2009**.
