JOB SUMMARY:

Touro College is seeking an adjunct professor to teach one or two courses pertaining to statistics and psychometric theory at our Bay Shore, Long Island campus. Topics include central tendency, variability, hypothesis testing with two samples, analysis of variance, correlation, regression, reliability, validity, test construction, and advanced methods of test validation. Includes both teachers primarily engaged in teaching, and those who do a combination of both teaching and research. Includes curriculum development, college service and academic advisement.

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

Duties include, but not limited to the following:

- Teach one to two graduate level statistics and psychometric theory courses at our Bay Shore, Long Island campus; each course meets three hours per week from September through December in the Fall 2012 semester
- Prepare course materials such as syllabi homework assignments and handouts
- Attend faculty meetings
- Be prompt and accurate in the recording and reporting of student data
- Support students' learning goals by:
 - Focusing on student learning outcomes
 - Taking into account the needs and abilities of the students
 - Becoming familiar with academic and social support

- Making reasonable provisions to accommodate individual differences
- Maintaining the academic integrity of the college
- Making himself/herself available to assist student in achieving their learning goals
