Lander College Valedictorian Scores 180 on LSAT

On May 18, Lander College celebrated the graduation of the most successful class since its establishment, with matriculated business students receiving job offers from KPMG, Price Waterhouse, Cornell Capital, Weiser, and The Federal Reserve. The addition of Dean Charles Snow, formerly of Sy Syms School of Business, to the college contributed to its success, as did the guidance of Dr. Ann Shinnar, formerly of Barnard College, over the pre-med program two of whose students were accepted to the Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

Highly noteworthy was the achievement of graduate David Rabinowitz of Great Neck, who achieved the rare feat of scoring a perfect 180 on his LSAT. Only 30 out of 140,000 students each year attain that score. Dean Moshe Sokol, acting as academic administrator of Lander College, remarked that Mr. Rabinowitz is an extraordinarily gifted student, who wrote “the best undergraduate paper I’ve seen in 15 years.” Mr. Rabinowitz plan on continuing his education at Yale University.

His success attests to his academic abilities as well as the award-winning faculty’s achievements in attracting scholarly superi-

ority. With the average SAT score of enrolled Lander students hovering at the 1200 mark and the addition of Ivy League caliber professors, the successes of the recent graduating class appear to continue a substantial trend for Lander College graduates in the years to come. *
