

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Touro College of Osteopathic Medicine, located in Harlem, New York, invites nominations and applications for the position of Dean, effective July 1, 2017.

Touro College of Osteopathic Medicine is accredited by COCA. The COM was established in 2007 in Harlem and in 2014 an additional location was opened in Middletown, New York. There are two other COMs within the Touro College and University System – TouroCOM Nevada (in Henderson, NV) and TouroCOM California (in Vallejo, CA). The Harlem, NY building where the COM is located also houses the Touro College of Pharmacy.

The ideal candidate will be a DO with a distinguished professional background that evidences the candidate's potential for leadership in achieving and maintaining excellence and innovation in teaching, research, scholarship and service; a commitment to serving the underserved and to ensuring access to the profession for qualified candidates, and as well as fundraising.

ABOUT TOURO COM

TouroCOM offers a four-year medical school program to educate physicians to practice in underserved communities. Clinical education is provided through affiliated teaching hospitals and medical centers throughout the region that provide a wide range of clinical exposure, and our dynamic flipped classroom best prepares our students for achievement. Our students and faculty work in the community to provide health screenings and patient education at our campuses, and offer mentoring and outreach for high school students to instill an interest in math and science to prepare them for the health professions.

TouroCOM has graduated from that 700 physicians who serve residencies at well-recognized local, regional and national academic medical centers in all specialties. Touro College offers a one-year Master of Science program hosted at our campuses that is distinctive amongst post-baccalaureate offerings. M.S. degree candidates are granted provisional acceptance into the DO program, subject to meeting the minimum grade requirements described in the Student Handbook.

TOURO COM ALUMNI

Touro COM's first graduating class was in 2011. A recent survey of the first three graduating classes reveals that half of our alumni is residency specialty program were in primary care. Almost half of the responding graduates entered a fellowship or sub-specialty after completion of residency program, and more than half responded that they are currently board-certified in their residency specialty. Forty-three percent reported that they currently work/practice in an urban area and about one third of the respondents currently work in a medically underserved area. A new alumni coordinator was hired in the spring 2017 to help us build an alumni program that will provide mentoring, continuing education and relationship management to better connect our alumni to the COM.

COMMUNITY ADVISORY BOARD

The TouroCOM Community Advisory Board (CAB) was created to guide the administrative leadership of TouroCOM to achieve it's mission of providing underrepresented minority students with the support and opportunity to become physicians and improve the health status of those communities that suffer the most from chronic disease, premature death, high infant mortality and high rates of cancer. TouroCOM's administrative leadership identified and recruited distinguished members of the healthcare, higher education, business and political sectors to advise it on creating a constructive working relationship with individuals and organizations in the Harlem Community seeking to improve the healthcare of its residents. The CAB assists the COM with fundraising specifically for student scholarships to help URM students who might not otherwise be able to afford the cost of medical education.

ABOUT TOURO COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

TouroCOM is part of the Touro College and University System, a system of non-profit institutions of higher and professional education. Touro College was chartered in 1970 primarily to enrich the Jewish heritage, and to serve the larger American and global community. Approximately 18,000 students are currently enrolled in its various schools and divisions.

Touro College has branch campuses, locations and instructional sites in the New York area, as well as branch campuses and programs in Berlin, Jerusalem, Moscow, and New York Medical College, Touro University California and its Nevada branch campus, as well as Touro University Worldwide and its Touro College Los Angeles division are separately accredited institutions within the Touro College and University System.
